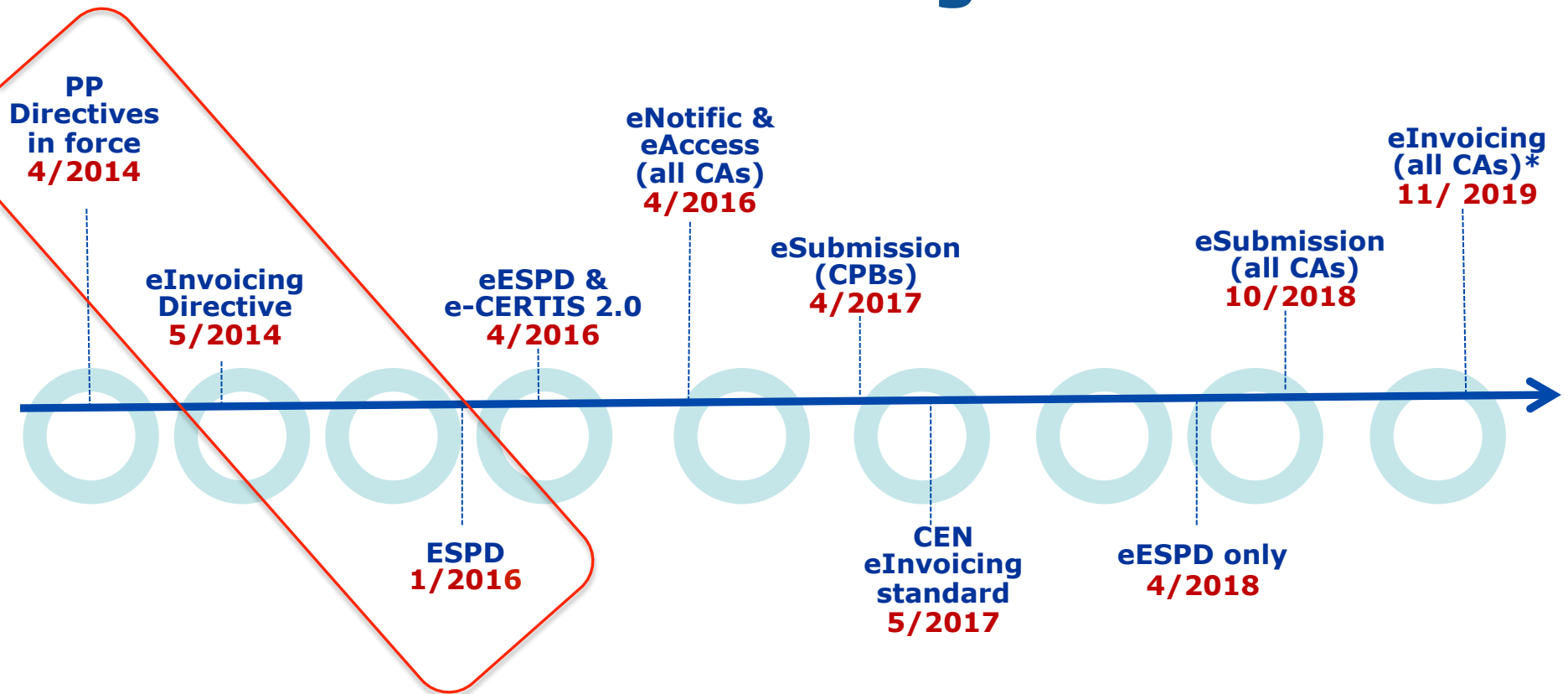

What has been agreed at EU level?

- **Commission may adopt delegated acts to address issues of interoperability (e.g. technical formats, messaging)**
 - Can impose standards, but very tough conditions for doing so
 - Proven problems of interoperability
 - Standard must already be in use and tested
 - COM to consider costs of adaptation of existing systems
- **Provisions on techniques and instruments for eprocurement**
 - DPS, e-auctions, e-catalogues

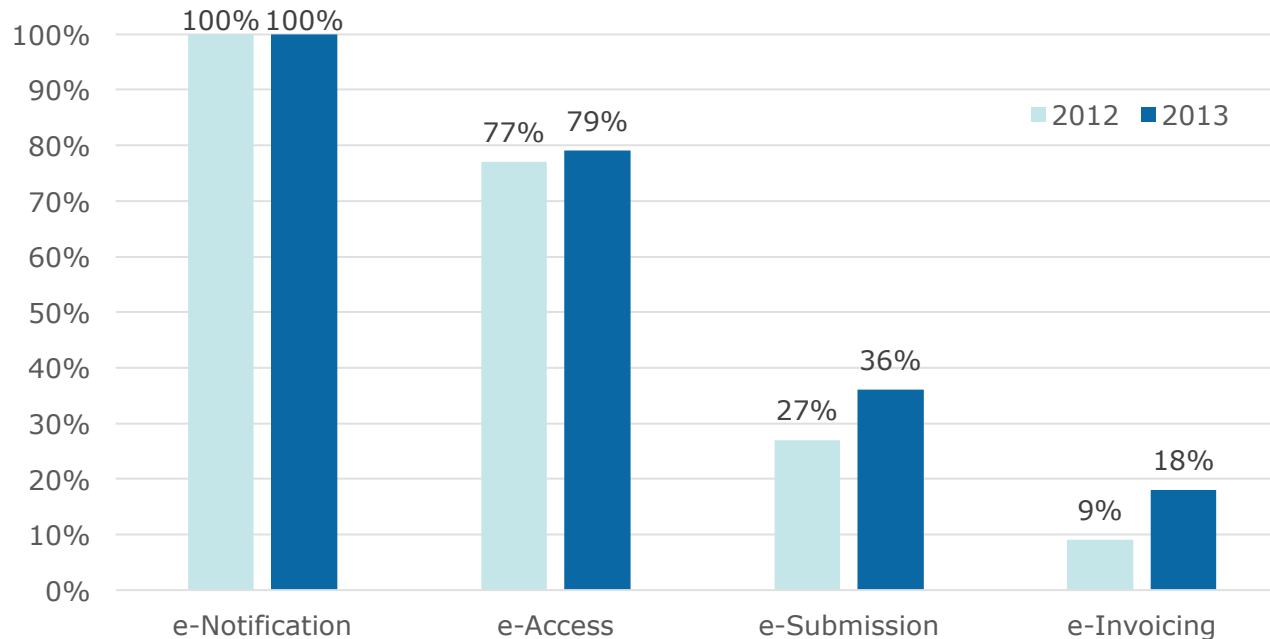
Timeline of PP digitisation
