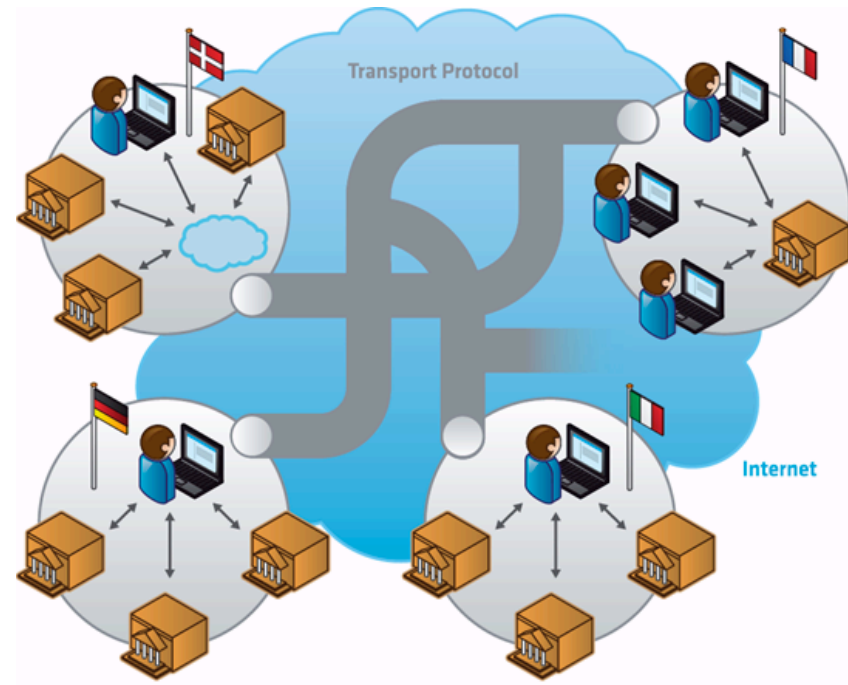

“To enable businesses to communicate electronically with any European government institution in the procurement process, increasing efficiencies and reducing costs.”





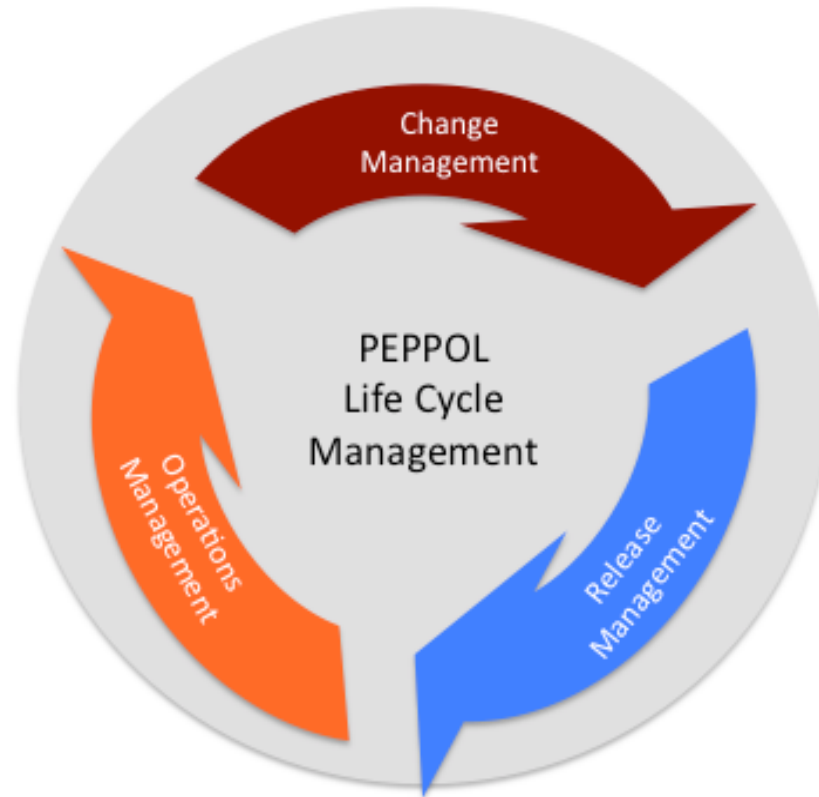

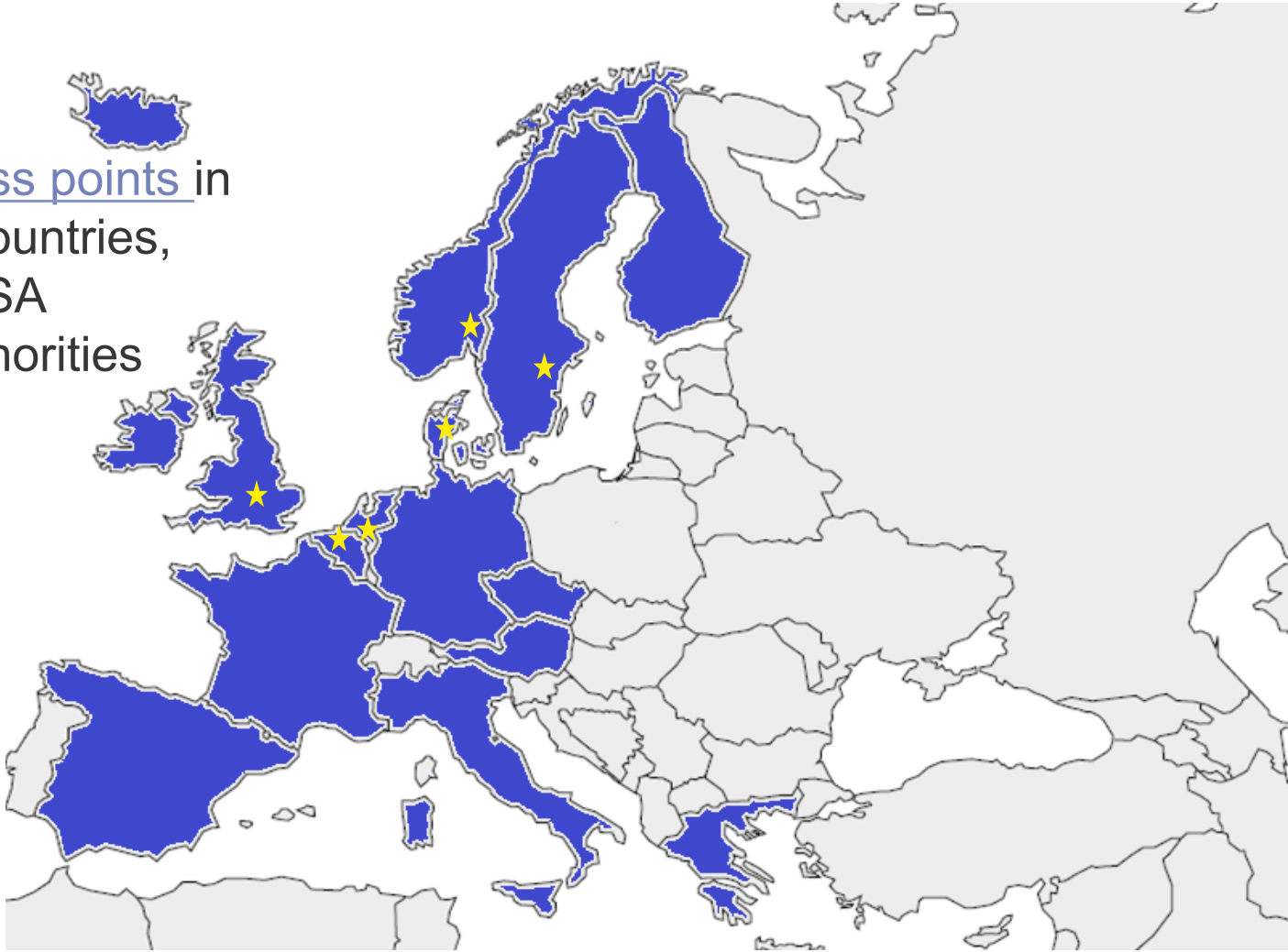

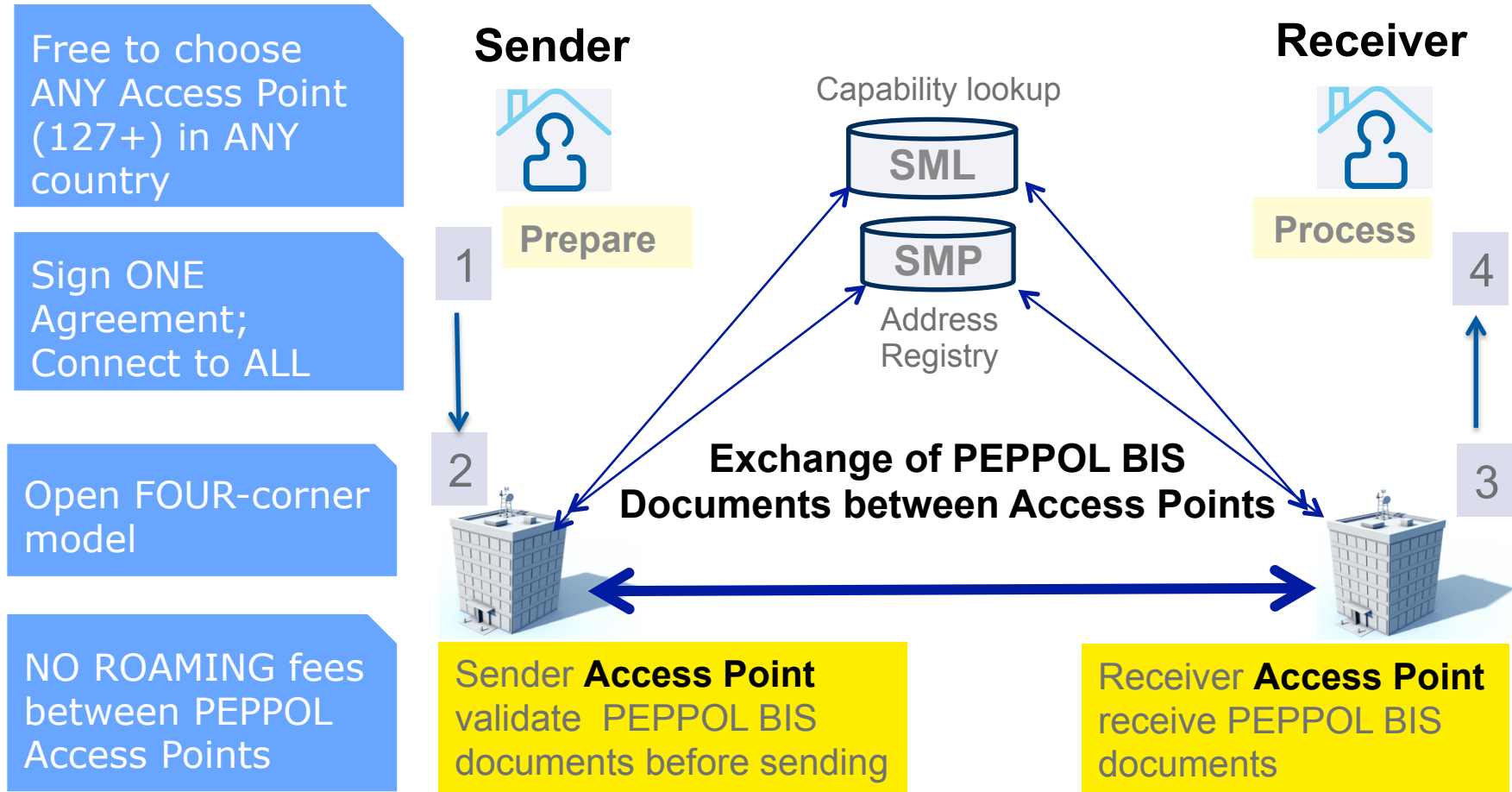

BII in OpenPEPPOL - PostAward

- ▶▶ Use of PEPPOL BIS based on BII specifications to enable Business Interoperability:
 - ▶▶ In the **Post Award** domain the following are supported in production based on the BII profiles and transaction models:
 - ▶▶ Catalogue
 - ▶▶ Order
 - ▶▶ Dispatch advise/shipping notes
 - ▶▶ Invoice/Credit note
 - ▶▶ Message Level Response (MLR)
 - ▶▶ For 2016 PEPPOL BIS release of Punch-out and Order Agreement is scheduled as well as planning for adoption of CEN EN for Invoicing

BII in OpenPEPPOL - PreAward

- ▶▶ OpenPEPPOL supports **PreAward** use case piloting in eSENS on the PEPPOL eDelivery network

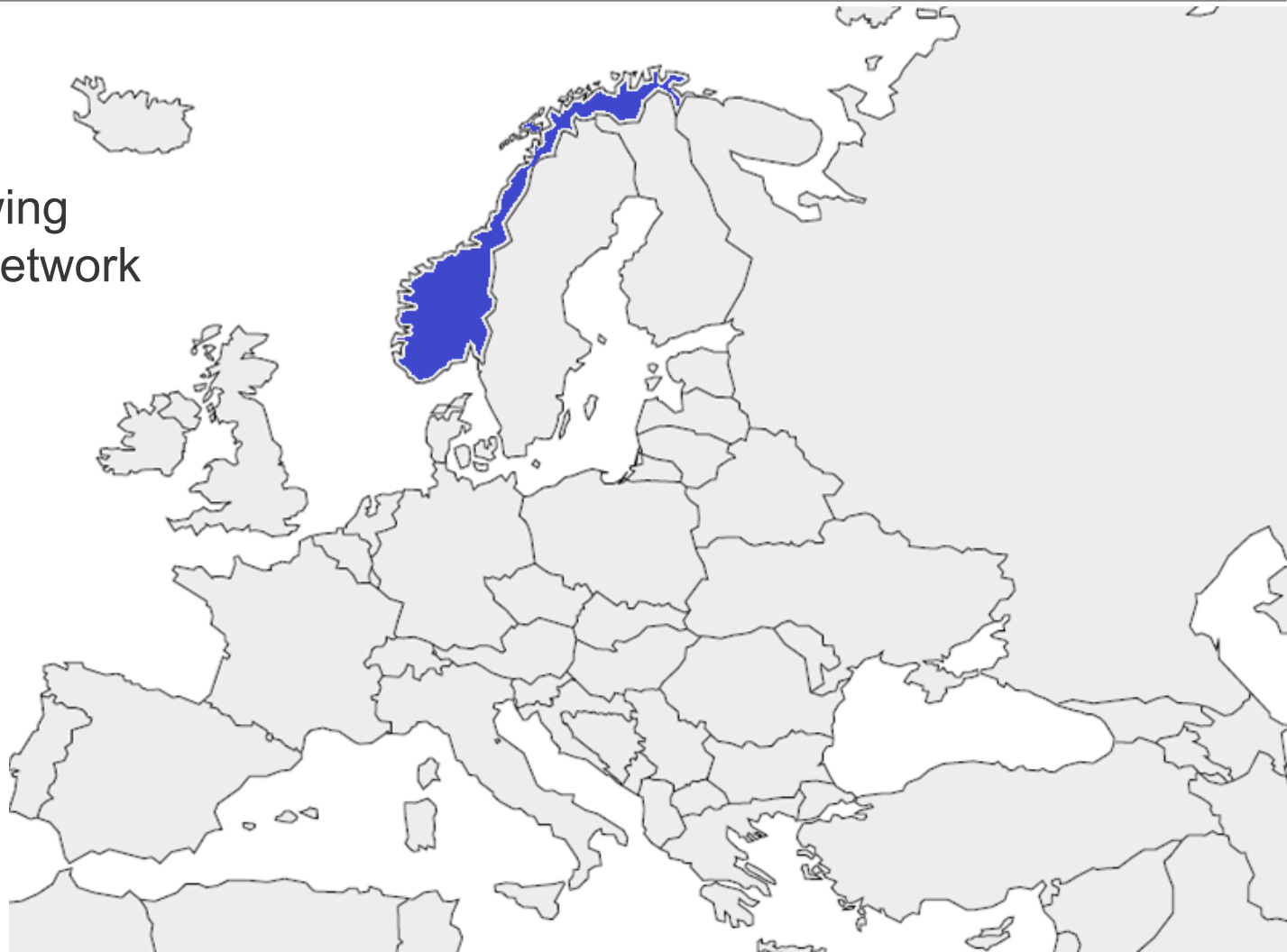
- ▶▶ Piloting includes solutions for the PreAward use cases, such as Tender submission and ESPD/VCD in cooperation with e-SENS based on BII specification.

- ▶▶ Planning for 2016 includes:
 - ▶▶ Phase-in of eSENS PreAward pilot results into PEPPOL BIS
 - ▶▶ Implement the PreAward use cases on the running PEPPOL eDelivery network with extended trust services

PEPPOL usage – Norway

- ▶▶ **Scope:** B2G; B2B; G2B; B2C.
- ▶▶ Use of PEPPOL approach reduces risk and cost as operational solutions are available and ready to be used for wider parts of the public procurement process
- ▶▶ PEPPOL for catalogues and ordering introduced in 2014
- ▶▶ Fastest growing e-invoicing network in Norway
- ▶▶ Public sector use of e-Invoicing benefits both government and businesses

Some key figures:

- ▶▶ **48.000 public and private sector recipients** registered (as of Dec 2016)
 - ▶▶ Vast majority of central government organisations, regions and municipalities can receive PEPPOL-based eInvoices
- ▶▶ **19 million** transactions in 2015, more than **50 Access Points** facilitating both domestic and cross border invoicing
- ▶▶ **37 ERP/software solutions** support issuing and/or receipt of PEPPOL BIS invoices



The future of OpenPEPPOL

- ▶▶ Consolidation and growth of OpenPEPPOL as a member based organisation responsible for governance of the PEPPOL network
 - ▶▶ Cooperation supported by Connecting Europe Facility (CEF) Digital
 - ▶▶ OpenPEPPOL as user community within
 - ▶ CEF eDelivery Digital Service Infrastructure (DSI)
 - ▶ CEF eInvoicing and eProcurement Digital Service Infrastructures (DSIs)
 - ▶▶ Access to support, services, software and funding for PEPPOL implementations as part of CEF DSIs within Member States
 - ▶▶ Continued support for cross border e-invoicing and e-procurement implementing directives 2014/55/EU on eInvoicing in public procurement and 2014/24/EU on public procurement
